Based on 250 working days per year, and Canada's average household income, one day of earnings is approximately \$200.


However, any amount is greatly appreciated and will go toward meeting the urgent needs in the community of San Antonio.

This year, the goal of the ONE DAY CHALLENGE is to provide basic housing and sanitary improvements to the neediest families in the village of San Antonio. One Day Challenge projects benefit families in extreme poverty, particularly the elderly, disabled, and those with young children, and where homes have serious safety and sanitary deficiencies.

These projects will be completed in partnership with World Renew and Diaconia Nacional de Honduras, who have been serving in San Antonio for more than 10 years.

## San Antonio, Yocon

Days are long and work is hard for the men and women of San Antonio, a remote village tucked away in a valley between the mountains of northern Olancho.

The community is blessed to have a kindergarten and school, a Christian Reformed church and a small health centre, although families here must survive on subsistence farming and average earnings of just \$1.50 US per day.

Men work in the fields, growing corn, beans, bananas, cassava root and some coffee, while women care for the children and also tend to a few chickens and pigs to help with the family income. The diet largely consists of beans, tortillas and eggs.

Many homes have dirt floors and are built from mud bricks, scrap wood, plastic and metal. Pipes and hoses bring water from the nearby stream, but there is no pila in which to store the water. Latrines are urgently needed for proper sanitation, to prevent disease and contamination of the stream.

Repairing their home is beyond the financial capability of families that earn \$1.50 per day. But YOU can help the people of San Antonio to realize their dream of a better future for themselves and their children through your support of the One Day Challenge.
